Jubilee Year and the Holy Doors of Rome

The opening of the Holy Door at the St. Peter's Basilica is an important part of Holy Years. The tradition was started by Pope Martin V in 1423, when he opened the Holy Door at the Basilica of St. John Lateran to decree the Jubilee year, and it is a tradition that has continued since.

The Holy Door in Rome will be opened by Pope Francis on Dec. 8, marking the beginning of the Jubilee Year of Mercy. When the Holy Door is opened, the Holy Father strikes it three times with a silver hammer, each strike representing a Scriptural "strike" such as Moses striking the rock and the Roman soldier striking Christ in the side with a spear. With these strikes, grace flowed forth, usually in the form of water, and in keeping with the symbology, the striking of the door symbolizes the releases of grace, flowing to the faithful.

Making a pilgrimage to the Holy Door is also a key piece of Jubilee years. It evokes the passage in the Gospel of John when Christ said, "I am the door," (Jn 10:9). Traditionally, the faithful would make a pilgrimage to Rome to pass through the Holy Door. Passing through the Holy Door is symbolic of leaving this world and entering into God's presence, and also of the removal of obstacles from clear passage to the Lord. St. John Paul II said that the

Because of political events, the Jubilees of 1800 (Pius VI and Pius VII) and 1850 (Pius IX)

Pius VII) and 1850 (Pius IX) were not celebrated; the 1875 Jubilee was held without ceremony.

Extraordinary Jubilees

The first one was declared by Leo X in 1518, to help Poland in its war against the Turks. The number of these is uncertain: the 1,900th and 1,950 anniversaries of the Redemption in 1933 (Pius XI) and 1983 (John Paul II) are well known.

Holy Door "…evokes the passage from sin to grace which every Christian is called to accomplish," and during the Extraordinary Jubilee, Catholics are called to make a pilgrimage to the Holy Door to do just this.

A jubilee is a special holy year of grace and pilgrimage in the Catholic Church. It typically takes place once every 25 years, though the pope can call for extraordinary jubilee years more often, such as in the case of the 2016 Year of Mercy or the 2013 Year of Faith.

A central part of any jubilee are the Holy Doors. These doors, found at St. Peter's Basilica and Rome's other major basilicas, are sealed from the inside and only opened during a jubilee year. In 2016, Catholic dioceses also had their own Holy Doors.

The opening of the Holy Door symbolizes the offering of an "extraordinary path" toward salvation for Catholics during a jubilee. Pilgrims who walk through a Holy Door can receive a plenary indulgence under the usual conditions.

Jubilees have biblical roots, as the Mosaic era established jubilee years to be held every 50 years for the freeing of slaves and forgiveness of debts as manifestations of God's mercy. The practice was reestablished by Pope Boniface VIII in 1300. Jubilees are planned years in advance, with the 2025 Year of Hope being no exception. The theme was announced in January 2022. Now, the city of Rome is preparing to launch a number of infrastructure projects to make the experience better for pilgrims.

Cheap Grace by Dietrich Bonhoeffer, Pastor, Theologian, and resister of the Nazi Regime

Cheap grace is the deadly enemy of our Church. The essence of grace, we [wrongly] suppose, is that the account has been paid in advance; and, because it has been paid, everything can be had for nothing....Cheap grace means grace as a doctrine, a principle, a system. It means forgiveness of sins proclaimed as a general truth.... [It] means the justification of sin without the justification of the sinner. Grace alone does everything they say, and so everything can remain as it was before... Well, then, let the Christian live like the rest of the world, let him model himself on the world's standards in every sphere of life, and not presumptuously aspire to live a different life under grace from his old life under sin....

Cheap grace is the grace we bestow on ourselves. Cheap grace is the preaching of forgiveness without requiring repentance, baptism without church discipline, Communion without confession.... Cheap grace is grace without discipleship, grace without the cross, grace without Jesus Christ, living and incarnate.

Costly grace, [on the other hand], is the treasure hidden in the field; for the sake of it a man' will gladly go and self all that he has. It is the pearl of great price to buy which the merchant will sell all his goods. It is the kingly rule of Christ, for whose sake a man will pluck out the eye which causes him to stumble, it is



the call of Jesus Christ at which the disciple leaves his nets and follows him... It is costly because it costs a man his life, and it is grace because it gives a man the only true life. It is costly because it condemns sin, and grace because it justifies the sinner. Above all, it is costly because it cost God the life of his Son: "ye were bought at a price," and what has cost God much cannot be cheap for us. Above all, it is grace because God did not reckon his Son too dear a price to pay for our life, but delivered him up for us. (*The Cost of Discipleship*, p.45-48)
