Lenten Regulations

FASTING, ALMSGIVING & prayer are the three traditional disciplines of Lent. The faithful and catechumens should undertake these practices seriously in a spirit of penance and of preparation for baptism or of renewal of baptism at Easter.

ASH WEDNESDAY, March 6, and **GOOD FRIDAY**, April, 19, are days of fast and abstinence. All Fridays of Lent are also days of abstinence from meat.

FASTING is to be observed **Ash Wednesday** and **Good Friday** by all Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59 years. On a fast day, one full meal is allowed. Two smaller meals, may be taken but together should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted but liquids are allowed.

ABSTINENCE from meat is observed by anyone 14 years of age and older. **ASH WEDNESDAY**, and all **FRIDAYS** are days of **abstinence**.

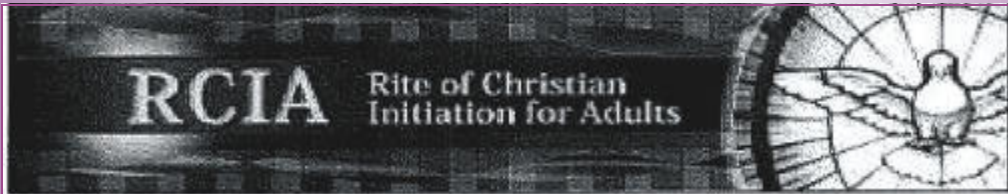

Why did God make me? God made me to know Him, to love Him, and to serve Him in this life, and to be happy with Him in heaven.

Before 1965 and the Second Vatican Ecumenical Council, this lesson was found in the Baltimore Catechism. It is among the first truths taught in religion class. This beautiful truth captures the essence of the Christian life. If we love God in this life, then we will be rewarded eternally in the next. Today we look to the Catechism of the Catholic Church as our resource to the deposit of faith of Christian doctrine.

God, infinitely perfect and blessed in himself, in a plan of sheer goodness freely created man to make him share in his own blessed life. For this reason and in every place, God draws close to man. He calls man to seek him, to know him and to love him with all his strength. (CCC Prologue I. 1)

Blessed with a spiritual and immortal soul, the human person is the only creature on earth that God has willed for its own sake. We are destined for eternal happiness with God.

The Church teaches that the one true God, our Creator and Lord, can be known with certainty from his works, by the natural light of human reason. (CCC 1:47)

By reason, man is capable of understanding the order of things established by the Creator. We recognize the voice of God which urges us to do what is good and avoid what is evil. Everyone is imbued with this law of nature, which makes itself heard in our conscience and is fulfilled in the love of God and of neighbor.

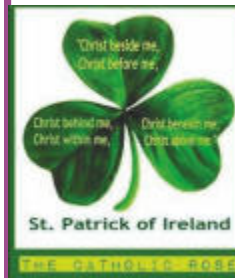
